Preparing Your Facility for Tomorrow Meet Facility Strategic Goals & Performance Targets



Is your healthcare facility prepared for tomorrow? Do you have a clear road map and established framework to grow/develop your healthcare facility into the future?

To best position your facility for success you need to understand your current state, current and future facility needs, and facility

Workload Allocation Modeling is the process of completing the following main objectives using visual mapping, quantitative Strategic Planning Category data, key VA workload projections, and facility as well as Veterans Integrated Service Network (VISN) leadership information to:

- Identify opportunities to better serve veterans by increasing access to necessary healthcare services as well as moving workload to improve efficiencies and reduce gaps in coverage
- Realize workload opportunities and issues in facility adjacencies, services, and space needs as well as quantify workload and FTE needs for planned and “hypothetical” scenarios in new/existing facilities and services
- Accomplish proactive strategic planning, at a facility market or VISN level, to be prepared for future healthcare demands by identifying workload quantities and FTE needs across all facilities

Deliverables are organized graphically as well as statistically to assist one in completing the VA’s HCPM as well as facilitate comprehensive strategic planning across a facility market or VISN.

Our Facility Master Planning demonstrates the thought process and effort that goes into developing a plan for a facility over a 20 year span. The Master Plans that we provide are a “living and breathing” document that doesn’t sit on a shelf once completed. The plans are organized in such a manner that describe different options for SCIP based on Facility MEP Projects, Energy Management Projects and Architectural Solutions; a plan that can be updated and used along with Workload Allocation Modeling and the HCPM yearly. We understand the “game planning” for NRM projects, Minor projects, Major projects and how and when those projects are approved. The final Master Plan Reports contain all of the data necessary to complete your yearly SCIP Process and are formatted in such a manner to be easily imported into the SCIP Automation Tool.
